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Legislative Ratings 100th General Assembly 2017

2017 Session Governor Rauner Rejects Legislative Efforts to Increase Business Regulation Costs

Governor Rauner vetoed a number of anti-jobs legislation that the legislature sent to him this year. The Governor was faced with a number of issues that expanded government intervention into employer benefit plans and added legal traps for APSA of Illinois members. Individually each measure increased the cost of doing business in our state. Together these bills posed a terrible blow to Illinois being able to compete for high paying jobs with good benefits. APSA of Illinois appreciates the Governor's willingness to stand with us and other business groups after facing intense pressure to sign these bills from organized labor and interest groups intent on dismantling Illinois' jobs climate.

Those bills vetoed will be considered by the General Assembly when it returns to Springfield for its Veto Session the last week of October and the first week of November. APSA of Illinois urges its members to contact their legislators and ask them to vote "no" on any override motion on the legislation that has been vetoed and described in the votes rated.

Lawmakers and candidates are circulating their petitions for office. With the current legislative maps, most legislators will effectively be elected at the March 2018 primary to the 101st General Assembly that is sworn in in January of 2019.

HB 1813 (K. Wheeler/Morrison) **Small Business Assistance-** Creates the "Networking for Success" Program to assist small to mid-sized businesses with: strategic market research; geographic information systems; web design and search engine optimization; and social media marketing. Passed the House: 113-0-0; Dead-no action on AV
APSA of Illinois Position: Support 5 points

HB 2462 (Moeller/Biss) **Wage History** Prohibits employer inquiry on wage history of a job applicant. Expands penalties and liabilities for employers. Passed the House 91-24; **veto pending in House**
APSA of Illinois Position: Oppose 5 points

HB 2525 (Concur) (Hoffman/Raoul) **"Fake" Workers' Compensation Reform-** Codification of current bad case law locking employers into court-expanded liability. Passed the House: 64-51; **veto pending in House**
APSA of Illinois Position: Oppose 15 points

HB 2624 (Fine/Biss) **Health Insurance Premium Regulation-** Requires rate regulation of health insurance. Passed the House 91-24; Not called in Senate
APSA of Illinois Position: Oppose 5 points

HB 2771 (C. Mitchell/Hutchinson) **Paid Sick Leave Mandate-** requires all employers to provide 40 hours of paid sick leave within a 12-month period. Passed the House 66-51; Concur motion pending in House

The 2018 elections will determine what direction Illinois takes for the next ten years.

HB 2959 (Fine/Biss) **Pre-existing conditions-** Mandates coverage of pre-existing conditions not only for health insurance but disability policies and specialty policies.

Passed the House 75-33 Public Act 100-386
APSA of Illinois Position: Oppose 5 points

SB 9 (Hutchinson/Davis) (Override) **Income tax increase-** Increases individual and corporate tax rates along with other tax changes.

Passed the House 71-42 Public Act 100-22
APSA of Illinois Position: Oppose 20 points

SB 81 (Lightford/Guzzardi) **Minimum Wage Increase-** phases in increases to the minimum wage to \$15 per hour on January 1, 2022. The legislation creates a convoluted credit against the withholding tax liability of employers with 50 or fewer employees.

Passed the House: 61-53-2 **veto pending in Senate**
APSA of Illinois Position: Oppose 20 points

SB 1720 (Biss/Hernandez) **State Contractor Penalties-** Bars an employer for 5 years from doing business with the State if found in violation of various wage laws. Increases penalties.

Passed the House: 67-48 **veto pending in Senate**
